Extremist Party AfD Wins Historic Election in Germany

The Alternative for Germany (AfD) party has made a historic gain in the state of Saxonia-Anhalt. They won 44.5% of the vote in the latest election according to exit polls. This marks the first time a far-right party has won a state government in Germany since World War II. The current ruling party, CDU, obtained only 18.5% of the vote. AfD leader Ulrich Siegmund has welcomed the result as a historic victory. Siegmund has won the election with a promise to create a majority government without any coalition partners. The outcome suggests that AfD may have the support of 44 seats in the parliament. This is enough to form a majority in the regional legislature. The party's platform includes anti-immigration and anti-LGBTQ measures. Siegmund has vowed to deport immigrants and ban LGBTQ flags in schools. He also plans to stop wind farms in the region. Ferrero Opens New Factory in Timișoara, Shifts Strategy for Romania

Nine Romanian Banks Report Losses Despite High Interest Rates

Almost one-third of the total number of credit institutions in Romania have reported losses. This data covers the end of the first semester of this year. Specifically, nine out of 29 banks are on loss. The rest of the banks, 69%, are operating at a profit. The key players involved include the Romanian banking system and the National Bank of Romania. Specific banks that have reported losses include some smaller institutions. These smaller banks have been experiencing frequent losses in recent years. Magnitude 4.1 Earthquake Shakes Romania's Vrancea Zone

A 4.1 magnitude earthquake occurred on Monday morning in the Vrancea seismic zone. Tremors were detected in several nearby cities across Romania. The earthquake had a depth of 149.6 km. It was located near Sfantu-Gheorghe, Brasov, Buzau, Focsani, and Ploiesti. Recently, Romania has reported an increase in seismic activity in the Vrancea zone. Seismologist Mihai Diaconescu stated that a series of six earthquakes in 24 hours does not indicate a precursory event. The earthquakes were of different depths and not on the same level of energy. Diaconescu explained that for a series to be considered precursory, they would need to be located on the same level. They would also need to have one with a significantly higher magnitude. The earthquake does not seem to pose a cause for concern currently. Seismologists do not anticipate a larger, more destructive earthquake in the near future. The earthquake is a reminder of the ongoing seismic activity in the Vrancea zone. This zone is a significant seismic hotspot in Romania. The earthquake highlights the importance of monitoring seismic activity. It also underscores the need for providing timely warnings in the event of an earthquake. Residents in the affected areas felt the tremors clearly. No structural damage has been reported so far. Authorities continue to monitor the situation closely. Private German Rocket Makes History, Reaches Orbit From European Soil

A German company, Isar Aerospace, successfully launched a Spectrum space rocket into orbit from the Arctic Norwegian spaceport at Andoya. This event marks a historic milestone in European spaceflight capabilities and independence. The launch was the company's second attempt and demonstrated Germany's innovative strength. The Spectrum rocket was designed for small and medium-sized payloads and carried five small satellites. This achievement is believed to bring Europe closer to offering satellite flights from its own territory. The market for commercial space missions is growing rapidly across the globe. Authors push back as publishers and agents make claims on Anthropic settlement

Authors who received payments from Anthropic's copyright settlement have started reporting issues with publishers. Publishers are claiming more than their fair share of the payments according to these reports. Authors such as April Henry and Victoria Strauss have expressed frustration on social media. They allege that publishers are incorrectly claiming rights that have reverted years ago. The Authors Guild is investigating the issue and believes it is largely due to poor record-keeping. The CEO believes the complaints are due to bad record-keeping rather than malice. However, Strauss notes that the unusual number of reports suggests a broader issue exists. Literary agencies are also making claims on the payments which Strauss finds surprising. The issue arises when the rights to a book revert to the original author. Authors must make a claim before a specific deadline to receive a full payment. Authors are urging publishers and agents to correct their errors and share more information. The dispute highlights the challenges of administering a large-scale settlement like this one. Authors are seeking clarity and transparency from the parties involved in the process. The settlement amount was \$1.5 billion which is a significant sum. Transparency is essential to maintain trust in the settlement administration process.

Phil Schiller's App Store exit reportedly driven by wariness over future plans

Where a Massive Solar Storm Could Take Down the US Power Grid for Millions

Flock Offered Webinar Teaching Cops How to Surveil 'No Kings' Protesters

This revelation matters because it highlights the widespread use of surveillance technology by law enforcement. Flock has pitched itself as a tool for predictive policing and crime solving. The article also challenges Flock's public stance on its ALPR technology. The company claims to be non-invasive and only used for worst crimes. This raises concerns about the misuse of surveillance technology in practice. Civil rights groups are calling for stricter regulations on these tools.

September Selloff Looms as Bond Volatility Spikes

Investors are bracing for a potentially turbulent September as historical data points to significant market weakness. Iran warns of 'faster, heavier, more painful response' to US attacks

Iran's Navy allegedly attacked a US remote-controlled vessel trying to enter the Strait of Hormuz. This waterway is crucial for global oil and gas trade. Trump claims the Strait of Hormuz is open. Iran insists it will not give up control over the waterway. Nine million barrels of oil pass through the strait daily. The US Energy Secretary says the situation is under control. Oil flows are continuing through regional pipelines. Gas prices should drop as summer demand wanes. The incident highlights the fragility of global energy supplies. Diplomatic solutions remain elusive amidst the rhetoric. Both nations are preparing for potential further conflict.

Peace talks rich in symbolism but fundamental differences between Russia and Ukraine remain

US envoys recently returned from Moscow with differing information. Ukraine claims to have gained more territory than lost. Reports suggest Russia is suffering significant casualties. Ukrainian officials state they gained territory in August. They report suffering 42,000 casualties during this period. This contrasts with tangible advances reported by Putin to US envoys. Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky insisted on strong security guarantees. Russian President Vladimir Putin pushed for Ukraine to cede territory. Putin also demanded Ukraine abandon its NATO ambitions. The talks took place in Moscow involving US envoys. The envoys returned to Ukraine following the meeting with Putin. Germany's far-right AfD set for big win in eastern state, just short of majority

The volunteers risking their lives to defuse Indonesia's wildfire 'carbon bombs'

Indonesia is facing a severe wildfire catastrophe currently. Thousands of active fire hotspots are spreading across the country. These fires are fuelling a transnational haze crisis. The fires are particularly worrying for Borneo's ecosystem. The tropical peatland ecosystem is a valuable natural carbon store. It is one of the world's largest carbon stores.
