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NASA Launches Roman Space Telescope as Trump Interrupts News Conference

NASA successfully launched the Nancy Grace Roman Space Telescope aboard a SpaceX Falcon Heavy rocket early this morning. The observatory is destined for the second Sun-Earth Lagrange point, located one million miles from Earth. Equipped with a 300-megapixel infrared camera, Roman boasts a field of view 100 times larger than the Hubble Space Telescope. Its primary mission involves mapping dark matter and investigating the mysterious force driving the universe's expansion known as dark energy. Scientists plan to survey supernovas, map galaxies, and study microlensing effects to achieve these ambitious goals. The telescope is also expected to directly image exoplanets, including smaller and colder worlds previously difficult to detect. NASA has committed to making all data collected by the telescope available for public

use by astronomers worldwide. In a surprising twist, President Donald Trump dialed into the post-launch news conference to congratulate the team. The President spoke directly to reporters and NASA officials through Administrator Jared Isaacman's phone during the briefing. Trump praised Isaacman's performance and expressed growing interest in space exploration initiatives. This unusual interruption marks a shift in priorities for the administration regarding space policy. Observers noted the rarity of a president calling into a technical NASA news conference unannounced. The mission represents a significant milestone in humanity's quest to understand cosmic history. Senior project scientist Julie McEnery highlighted the importance of the three different detection methods planned. The scientific community has been eagerly awaiting this breakthrough to answer long-standing questions about the universe. Roman's advanced technology positions it to make groundbreaking discoveries over its five-year planned mission. The successful deployment sets the stage for unprecedented surveys of the sky compared to previous observatories. Texas Governor Freezes Funding for AI Surveillance Cameras Amid Privacy Backlash

Texas Governor Greg Abbott has frozen state spending on Flock Safety's AI surveillance cameras following intense backlash. The cameras were initially funded to combat catalytic converter theft across the state. Investigations revealed that over \$30 million was spent on the system, largely funded by a fee on insurance policies. Privacy advocates raised alarms over camera placements near sensitive locations like playgrounds. Concerns also emerged regarding employee access to video feeds and aggressive data-sharing practices. The Texas Tribune investigation brought these issues to light, sparking bipartisan criticism. Democratic opponent Gina Hinojosa and Republican representative Keith Self both voiced strong opposition. Several cities across the United States have already cancelled their contracts with the surveillance company. The internet has become a rallying point for activists opposed to the widespread camera network. Abbott's decision to block further funding marks a significant policy reversal for the administration. This move highlights growing public concern over government surveillance and privacy rights erosion. Critics argue the technology lacks sufficient transparency and accountability measures. The controversy underscores the tension between public safety initiatives and individual civil liberties. Legal experts suggest this decision could set a precedent for other states considering similar technology. Flock Safety has faced scrutiny over how long data is retained and who can access it. The state will now need to review existing contracts before proceeding with any future installations. Privacy groups are calling for stricter regulations on automated license plate readers. Ultimately, the freeze signals a victory for privacy advocates monitoring surveillance expansion.

Chess.com Expands into Poker and Classic Games Using AI Development

Chess.com has officially launched a new companion site called Gambit dedicated to online poker. The platform is designed to teach players the game without requiring them to risk real money. Gambit follows a similar design style to the main chess platform, featuring interactive lessons and modes. An Elo-style rating system will track player improvement over time within the poker environment. The site is currently in beta but has already attracted 75,000 members since its release. Users have played nearly 20 million hands during this initial testing period. Chess.com chief growth officer Albert

Cheng credits AI with enabling the platform's rapid development. The team managed to create the new platform in under a year thanks to AI prototyping tools. This efficiency reduced the need for a larger development team or disrupting existing workflows. The company is already planning to expand into other classic games beyond poker and chess. Future titles expected to launch include go, backgammon, and mahjong. AI will be used to develop similar Elo-style rating systems for these additional games. A paid subscription model is planned to support the growing ecosystem of games. The site will focus heavily on community and social elements to retain users. Collaborations with content creators are part of the strategy to reach new audiences. The first livestreamed event is scheduled for August 31st featuring prominent chess personalities. Danny Rensch and Alexandra Botez are set to headline the inaugural tournament broadcast. The move showcases the potential of AI to accelerate innovation in the gaming industry.

Apple Refreshes Mac Mini and Studio with New M6 and M5 Ultra Chips

Apple has refreshed its desktop lineup with the release of new Mac Mini and Mac Studio models. The new Mac Mini features options for the latest M6 chip and the M5 Pro chip. Physicists Demonstrate 'Rainbow on a Chip' to Supercharge 6G Networks

Physicists at Loughborough University have demonstrated a microchip-based system for 6G communications. The team, led by Dr. Luke Peters, successfully generated a highly organized rainbow of light. This capability is crucial for the development of next-generation 6G networks and quantum technologies. The system utilizes a microcomb to produce a series of precisely spaced light frequencies. A specialized antenna converts these frequencies into millimeter waves for transmission. This technology has the potential to provide significantly more bandwidth for data transfer. Faster and more precise applications will be enabled by this increase in transmission capacity. The research tackles a major obstacle in the production of millimeter waves. This paves the way for their use in radar systems and spectroscopy. Astronomical instruments could also benefit from the precise measurements enabled by the chip. The potential applications extend beyond communications into material science studies. Scientists may use the technology to make precise measurements of the universe. The research team is now exploring how to translate the laboratory experiment into practical technology. 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US Strikes Iranian Launchers in Escalating Tensions

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Fed Rate Hike Fears Spook Global Markets

Federal Reserve Chairman Kevin Warsh is expected to raise interest rates at the central bank's next decision in mid-September, according to swaps traders. Iran Conflict Costs Mount As Blockade Tightens

US Democrats are criticizing the Trump administration for dragging out the war on Iran, which is now in its sixth month. Taxpayers Foot \$65 Billion Bill For Obamacare Fraud

Taxpayers spent \$65 billion on health insurance premiums for individuals who did not qualify for benefits in 2024. This waste occurred across two federal programs, Expanded Medicaid and Obamacare. Researchers at Paragon Health

Institute found that 14.3 million people were improperly enrolled in these programs. Approximately 9 million were likely not eligible for Medicaid coverage. Another 6.5 million more were enrolled in 2025 despite eligibility issues. Key organizations involved include the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services and Covered California. The issue matters because it highlights waste and potential fraud in the healthcare system. Taxpayers are footing the bill for ineligible individuals across the United States. The report's findings have raised skepticism among some observers regarding the research method. Critics argue that the analysis does not account for all variables in the enrollment data. However, the federal government has taken steps to address the issue recently. These steps include suspending agents and brokers for suspected fraud. They have also focused on removing ineligible enrollees from the rolls. These efforts have resulted in \$10 billion in annual savings for the government. The problem is ongoing, with improper enrollment increasing by 26% from 2024 to 2025. Continued vigilance is required to prevent further losses to the federal budget.
